

39 color plates, unpaginated, 11 1/2 x 9 inches, cloth covered boards with color cover pictorial paste-on. The volume has evidently been much read. The hinges are cracked, text block a little loose with one inch split at lower edge but still attached, the frontispiece is detached with creases and short edge tears; a little loss to the lower left edge of "Summer Fiction" (well outside the image), sheet of "Reflections of a Bachelor" is detached with edge tears, paper loss at right edge and crease at upper left; several plates have a creased lower left corner. Sold with all faults.

A Map of the British Province of New Brunswick, From the Best Existing Materials; By Authority of the Provincial Legislature. With Adjacent Prts of Canada, Nova-Scotia and Maine.**

Huge engraved handcolored folding map, 49 1/4 x 50 1/2 inches on sheet 51 x 53 inches, dissected into 60 parts and mounted on linen. Overall light foxing, the glue adhering a few panels has dried with the panels beginning to detach from the backing, but all panels are present. A huge map that we have not been able to photograph so as to do it justice; the map online at the Digital Maine Repository is dated one year later, but overall is a good resemblance. Map folds into a cloth-covered slipcase which is likely the publisher's slipcase lacking the original title label; "Canada 1858" has been written on both sides of the slipcase which is split on one vertical side.

*A magnificent, extremely detailed map, the first map of this important British possession to be drawn up and compiled by John Wilkinson from Admiralty, boundary and other official surveys, dated 1858 and published in 1859. International Boundaries, Intercolonial Boundaries, Boundaries of Counties and Parishes, Common Roads, Railways opened and in progress are marked. A section of "Statistical Memoranda" is at lower left; at lower right is a "Chart (on Mercator's Projection) showing the relative Geographical Position of New Brunswick and of the Several Provinces forming part of British America with the Shortest Sailing Distance to The British Isles." Verso features information for the fresh water and salt water angler, Brief History of the Commission, plus Map of New Jersey Showing Locations of the Public Shooting Tracts, State Forests, Game Preserves, Game Farms and Fish Hatcheries. *Articles include Hollywood's Lowe's Incorporated ("It's a \$144,000,000 trust, and the government says it's illegal."); The Republican Party (color cartoon map of US by Erik Nitsche: "Geography for the GOP" picturing Dewey, Landon, Hoover, etc.); Bucyrus-Erie dredges, draglines, etc.; Piano manufacturing; Larchmont Yacht Club (water colors by Hardie Gramatky) with detailed double-page color map of Western Long Island Sound; The Press and the People—a Survey ("Where do the people get their news? Is it accurate?" Etc.) Full page color ads include Kodachrome Film; International Trucks. Cover illustration depicting Weather Sensor by H. Barschel. 
Very decorative handcolored maps of the Eastern and Western hemispheres, color maps and views throughout, 18 x 15 inches, gilt embossed decorative cloth covered boards, considerable wear to edges, spine which was in poor condition has been reattached and the hinges reinforced so that the very hefty volume is now sturdy and can be safely handled. Title page and frontispiece are creased: title page has long tears and has been crudely mended; double page sectional map of Iowa (p.20-21 ) has a detached piece 3 1/2 x 1 inch at lower left centre but this piece is present; occasional short margin tears and light soiling to the first few sheets of the volume, but as you turn the sheets in the volume the wear/soiling lessens (as interest declined presumably). The last 12 pages of the volume are creased. The cover boards are original but very worn, rebacked and repaired; the hinges have been reinforced. The

pagination has some gaps, but it seems clear from the tightness of the binding that these pages were never present: p 30-31; p 69-70; p 85-86; p 97-98 p109-110; 113-114; p 119-120; two different pages numbered 122. There are two pages numbered: 129; 163-164; 191-192; 243-4. There is some inconsistent numbering in the lengthy text section, but the sections appear to be complete. No page 281-282 but p. 280 is the Biographical Sketches section which is marked "concluded" and the following page is a new section: State of Iowa. Despite this list of condition issues the heavy volume is a treasure trove of information and a formidable testament to the state of Iowa in the late 19th century.

*This is the original version of the social commentary and entertainment magazine Life, not the news photo magazine first issued in November 1936. This issue, published at the beginning of the year in which Theodore Roosevelt's Progressive Party included women's suffrage in its platform, reflects that social reality: a cover with a bow-tie wearing woman is seen choosing between figurines of men marked as "moneyed," "mediocre", "business" etc. Inside notes include: "Women are Women...The Votes for Women war seems to be promoted on the theory that woman is a beardless man..." Also an article "Mrs Pankhurst at Harvard," Presidential coverage etc. \$95.00*

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

*Images highlight with humor the many facets of the book world, the voracious pig standing in for the human actor. Images including: a hawker pushing his barrow outside a large and upmarket book shop; a book auction in progress; a book seller in his shop; the aftermath of the collapse of overlaid bookshelves; a book thief being apprehended; and book pig at the top of a ladder, deep in communion with multiple books at hand. Set of six volumes bound as three, with 38 (of 39, not present: South Australia) double page engraved maps with outline handcolor. The set itself has condition issues but the maps present as clean and bright (one has light staining on the verso, scarcely visible on the front of the map). The map of the Western Hemisphere is sewn in (3 binding holes) with the following text section, in what appears to have been a fix. Uniform light toning to maps (most noticeable in the first volume), occasional spotting, but overall good to very good condition. There is waterstaining to the steel engraved portrait plates and to the title page of volume 1 but not to the rest of the volume (it appears that the volume was assembled with the plates already stained). 1 inch square of paper loss to lower corner of Victoria engraving and facing page. Third volume: front board and first pages water damaged with loss to cloth and deterioration to front board, some waterstaining to portrait plates, but maps not affected. Includes: Chrysanthemum, Cattleya, Dahlia, Orchid, Anemone, Chrysanthemum, Ivy, Roses, Ferns... Beautiful, brilliantly coloured images. \$285.00*

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
